The Harold Adams Innis Prize went to Nancy Christie and Michael Gauvreau of McMaster University for A Full-Orbed Christianity: The Protestant Churches and Social Welfare in Canada, 1900-1940, McGill-Queen's University Press, 1996. Pierre Camu won the Jean-Charles Falardeau Prize for Le Saint-Laurent et les Grands Lacs au temps de la voile, 1608-1850, Les Éditions Hurtubise HMH, 1996.
